Services are provided by dental hygiene students under professional supervision. Services that must be performed by a dentist, such as fillings or dentures, are not available at this clinic.

<sup>2</sup> Crossroads Rhode Island accepts adults only.

<sup>3</sup> Providence Community Health Centers' dental services are for children and pregnant patients only.

<sup>4</sup> Dental patients must receive at least one type of service from Tri-Town CAP in order to be treated in the dental clinic.

<sup>5</sup> Samuels Sinclair Dental Center serves adults who have special health care needs and/or developmental disabilities. There may be a waiting list for appointments.

Dentists also may place limits on how many patients they treat. For example, dentists may only provide care to current patients, patients who live in the community in which the dental office is located, and/or patients of certain ages.
